Barbara Roddis had received a redundancy notice from her employers at the time, the Direct Line Group, when she heard about TCHC's Skills Support for Redundancy programme, which is funded by the Skills Funding Agency and the European Social Fund. Unsure of which direction to take with her career, she was looking for a programme that could help her obtain employment. Barbara realised that the programme could help her.

Her programme began with an Information, Advice and Guidance (IAG) session with an experienced TCHC Adviser who discussed her career goals and aspirations through with her and helped her set career objectives to help her succeed in her job search.

She then attended an Employability Skills Session where she was guided through writing CVs and covering letters. She found the training excellent as she learned a lot about the job search process which she did not already know, particularly information relating to interviews.

As a result of the knowledge and skills she has developed since going on the programme, Barbara has managed to gain further employment. The programme was valuable in building her confidence and helping her to gain a better understanding of the job search process.
